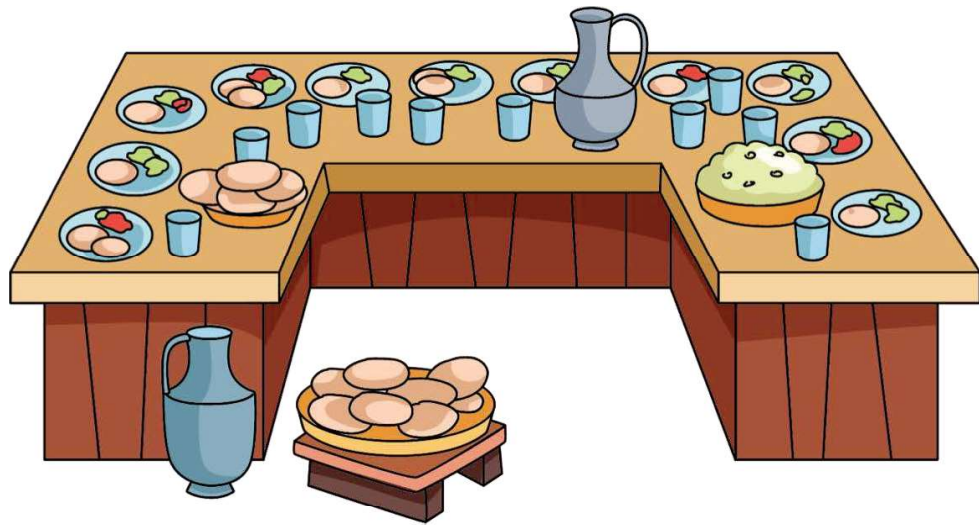

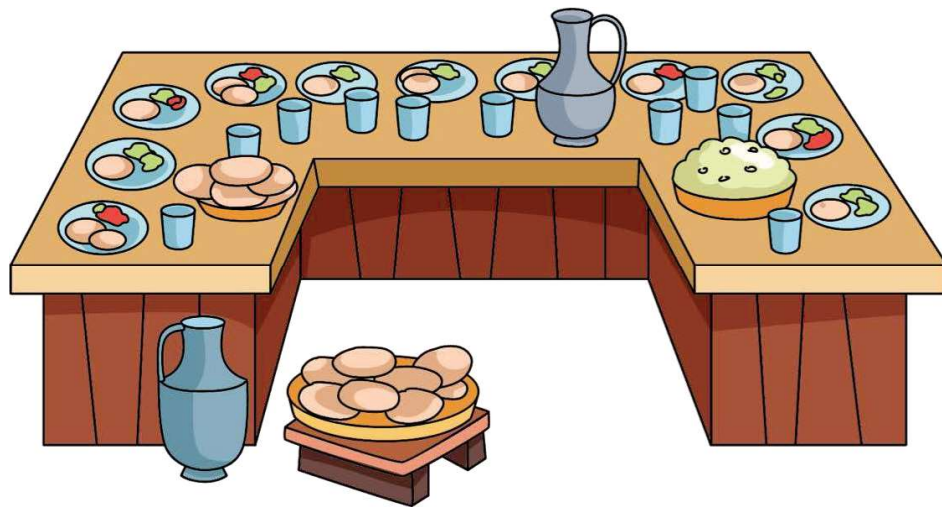
Jesus and his disciples celebrated the Passover with a meal.

Jesus was arrested and the disciples fled just as He had said. Peter did follow at a distance.



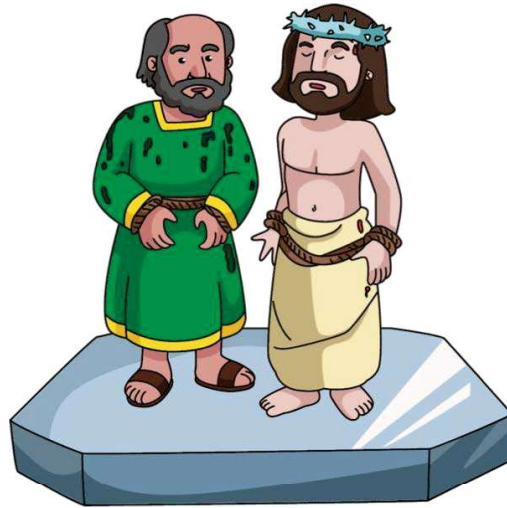
While waiting to see what happen to Jesus, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times. Immediately, the rooster crowed and Peter remembered what Jesus has said.



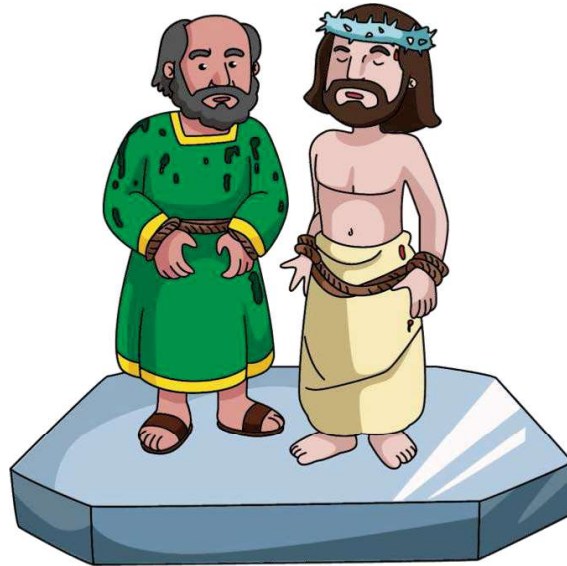
Jesus was brought before Pilate,

As was the custom at Passover, one Jewish prisoner was to be released. The choice was between Barabbas and Jesus.



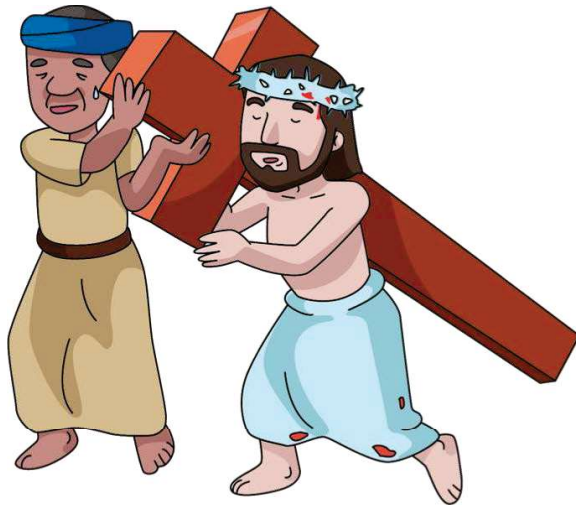
The crowd called for Barabbas to be released and for Jesus to be crucified.



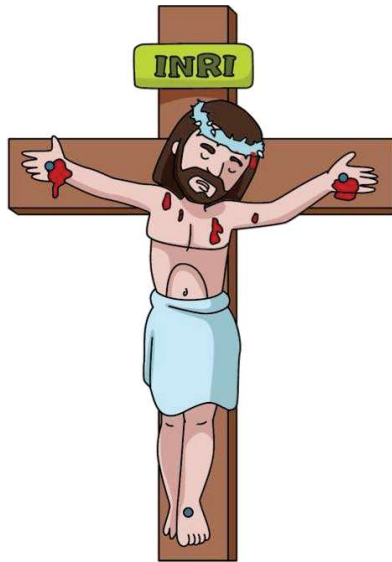
Pilate washed his hands in front. This was to show that he didn't want any blame if something went wrong. He released Barabbas.



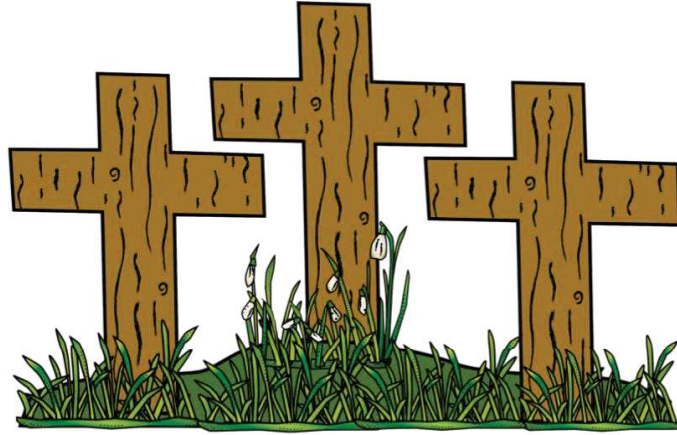
Jesus was beaten and then handed over to be crucified.



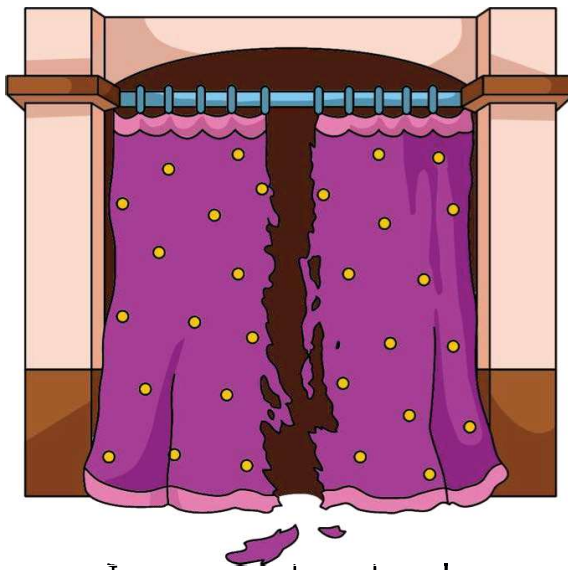
A crown of thorns was put on Jesus' head, and he was given his cross to carry. Jesus was struggling, so a man named Simon was told to help him.



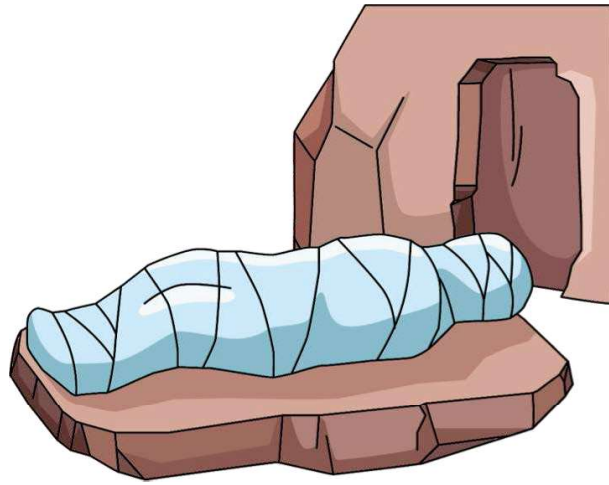
When they came to Golgotha, they nailed Jesus to the cross.



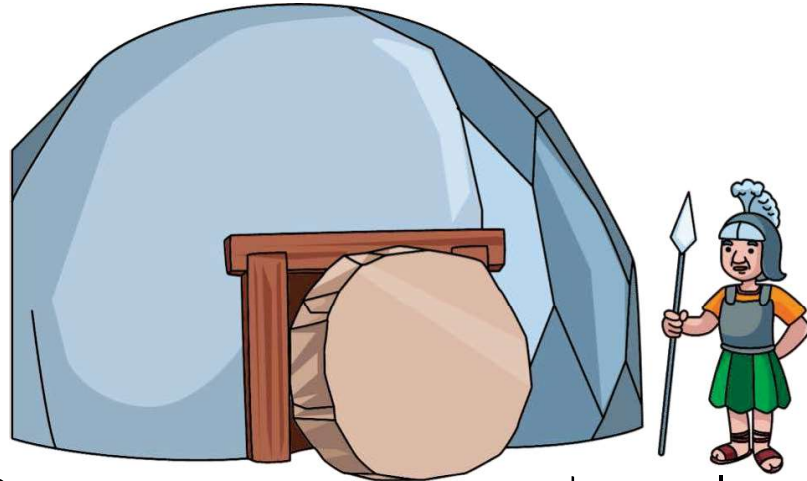
Two thieves were being crucified at the same time, one on each side of Jesus. In the afternoon, the place went dark. Jesus cried out.
